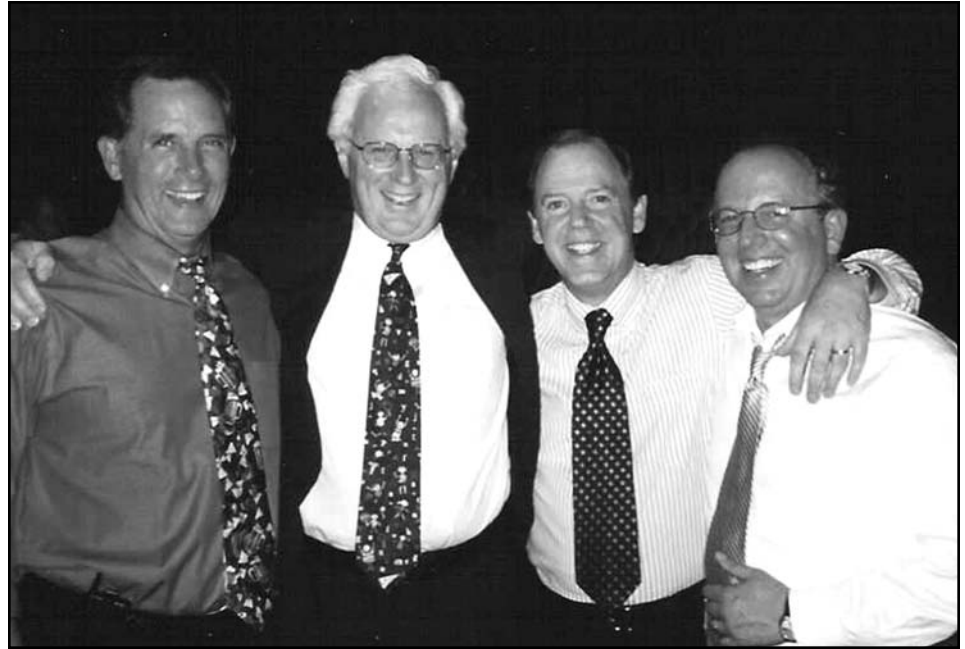

# Capital Campaign Update

This message is to provide you with an update regarding the recent activity of Tau Chapter's Capital Fundraising Campaign and renovation plan. If you have been through Chapel Hill recently, you will notice that there is a major renaissance in Greek housing. These projects have mainly been brought about by the fire and safety system mandate imposed by the City of Chapel Hill (Fall 2001 deadline).

Many chapters have completely renovated their facilities and added new fire and safety systems while others have been forced to close their doors until such renovations and upgrades occur. As you know, our Pi Kappa Alpha house is one of those houses that has closed, but over the past two years we have been working on a plan to get Tau Chapter back on its feet.

While our Undergraduates did recruit a total of 6 new members during both Fall and Spring rush this year, we lost another 15 on the last day of each rush due to our lack of a house (DKE, Beta, and Phi Delt took all 15—all three have new facilities). For the sake of both our undergraduates and our alumni, we cannot afford to go another two semesters without a functioning facility.

We are truly at a critical point in the campaign. It has taken us 18 months to put the proper 501(c)(7) Building Corporation structure in place so that we will run a successful fraternity presently and for many years to come. The Tau Chapter Building Corporation is eternally busy with the many moving pieces of our project. Our Finance, Legal, Housing, and Fundraising committees are moving as fast as they can go, but without more leadership and dollar support we may lose momentum.

With regard to the building project itself, we have contracted Michael Hining Architects to develop our demolition/construction/renovation plans and Resolute Builders of Chapel Hill with regard to our general contracting needs. Over the past six months, both firms have embarked on developing a plan using value engineering that will enable us to re-build our house to meet our needs in the most cost and time efficient manner.

We have recently held many successful alumni reunion/fundraising events and are currently planning more for this Spring and for the Fall, so please be on the lookout for news in the near future.

It is imperative that we communicate with each and every alumnus so that all

understand the full scope of our project and the immediacy of our needs. Our fundraising is progressing daily, but we are still in need of good class representatives to contact their Brother's personally. I think that we all truly share in the feeling that we need to get the PiKA house re-opened—not only for our undergraduate members and future members, but more selfishly for ourselves. It is very disheartening to go back to Chapel Hill and realize that we do not have a place for PiKAs and their families to commune. This is a sad contrast to the DKE, Beta, Phi Gamma Delta, and KA lawns which have been full of activity each of this past fall's home football weekends. Lets band together as PiKAs and show our support for our fraternity, once again taking it to the top of the Carolina Greek System.

# Anticipating Productive, Rewarding Year

I would first like to start by expressing how humbled and enthusiastic I am about the opportunity to address the Alumni of the Tau Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha as Chapter President. Over the years that I've spent in this chapter, I have been privileged to have met several former presidents and can only hope to perform as admirably and dependably as they have during their respective terms. I look forward to the year to come and anticipate another productive and rewarding year on both a Chapter and individual basis.

I believe, as do all of the undergraduates that I have spoken with, that we have had a successful year thus far. Our newly elected Executive Council is a collection of the most responsible and reliable young men I have ever met and I feel that this Council will make sure we continue in our achievements. One of the most obvious examples of this success is the most recent publishing of the Greek Grade Report, which ranked 4th among all fraternities with a house G.P.A. of 3.027. The great thing about this current group of men is that our success has not stopped in the classroom. We also averaged over 12 hours of community service per person and won the Interfraternity Intramural Football Championship in the process. In fact, we

are well positioned to repeat this next year.

Rush has been very difficult, considering we did not have a house at our disposal for the first time in recent history. We were able to recruit three men in the fall. In early November, we initiated our three pledges into our sacred Brotherhood. Regardless of this accomplishment, however, the Brothers were somewhat disappointed and discouraged by such a low number. In the past two years, we have had the most number of pledges of any house on campus, totaling 40 brothers. The feeling in the house was extremely enthusiastic - we felt like we were truly gaining momentum for a breakout year - but were unfortunately held back for one simple reason: no fraternity house.

Rest assured, only getting three pledges in the fall and hopefully a few more in the spring will add to our overall number due to the fact that we are lucky to have a very young base membership (we are only losing seven Brothers to graduation this year). One thing that we cannot ignore is that the recruitment and membership problem arises in the next two years as we expect to be graduating ninety-percent of our current membership. If we are to struggle with Rush next fall, the future would be discouraging.

Clearly, much of the concern of the Brothers focused on the lack of a central meeting location, a place that would always bring the Brothers together. Without this, we feared that we would lose our sense of togetherness and Brotherhood. I am pleased to report that so far, we have adapted to the recent change very well and seem to be as close and strong this year as any other previous year.

We realize that we have a responsibility to each other, the house, and to every Brother that has ever walked through our doors to persevere, to stay committed, and to never lose that special feeling of pride and dignity that accompanies being a PiKA at the greatest university in the world.

Having a house is an essential aspect of remaining a strong fraternity and I would be lying to myself, and others, if I did not articulate that specific point. Indeed, it is something that we all must continue to work for, putting forth our best and most concerted effort. Nevertheless, I want you, the Alumni, to know that we have been, are, and will continue to be a group of young men totally devoted to the well-being of our house.
